Pregnant and alone, Cathie went to a Crisis Pregnancy Center to seek help. She was told about a new home for girls that was forming and would be opening soon — *Bethany House*.

Founder and Director, Beth Rhinehart, along with her husband, Jack (known as Grandpa) opened their home to Cathie. A special family was formed. Cathie came to know the Lord and was moving forward in her life when along came Lucas, who everyone loved, and watched grow up before their eyes.



Overnight, Luke grew into a young man and was successfully completing high school. Needless to say, he had a very proud "family" watching him accept his diploma.

Then came the announcement, "I'm going into the Marines." I think in that moment, we could have heard a pin drop. This was a young man who couldn't even keep his room clean! Our minds were filled with images of the little boy born so long ago in our ministry that was just beginning.
